FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

WHEREAS, it appears that, by inadvertence, Decision No. 43969 failed to incorporate the restriction contained in the second amendment to the application, that the articles of freight enumerated in paragraph II, subparagraph (5) of said application be carried only when moving to or from a well site, drilling site, oil field, storage yard, or warehouse, and

WHEREAS, the evidence of record supports the inclusion of such restriction in applicant's certificate, but applicant should not be restricted in carrying said articles when so moving to points in excess of ten miles on either side of the highways over which he is authorized to operate, necessitating a modification of restriction (d) of said decision,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that ordering paragraph numbered (1), subparagraph (e), on page 6 of Decision No. 43969, dated March 14, 1950, in Application No. 30511, as amended, be, and it hereby is, amended by substituting for the first two lines thereof, the following lines:

- (e) Oil, water, or gas well outfits and supplies, and other articles, when moving to or from a well site, drilling site, oil field, storage yard, warehouse, or supplier, viz.:

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that ordering paragraph numbered (1), on page 8 of said Decision No. 43969, be, and it hereby is, amended so that restriction designated (d) will read as follows:

- (d) Except for deliveries to and from job sites such as construction projects, oil, gas, or water wells, or mines, oil fields, warehouses or field storage yards, no freight shall be transported in excess of ten (10) miles on either side of the routes over which this certificate authorizes applicant to operate.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
