OPINION AND ORDER

Railway Express Agency, Incorporated, seeks authority to discontinue collection and delivery service for express shipments at Niles, Alameda County. Shipments would thereafter be received and delivered at applicant's office.

The verified application shows that the express office is centrally located and that no point at which collection and delivery service is now offered is more than one-fourth mile distant therefrom. It also shows that there is little patronage of the service, and the interested shippers were notified and offered no objection to its withdrawal.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary, and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above-entitled application be and it is hereby granted.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
