OPINION AND ORDER

This application involves public utility warehouse property situated at Tulelake, Siskiyou County. The property was owned and operated by Paul J. Dalton, Dale West, Mark Evans and Louie Lyon, copartners, doing business as Calore Packing Company. They filed their initial tariff with the Commission, effective July 7, 1947, and conducted the warehouse operations until September 19, 1947. On the latter date, the copartners incorporated the business under the name of Calore Packing Co., Inc., and transferred the warehouse property to the corporation. They owned all of the corporation's stock. On December 22, 1949, they formed a new copartnership to do business under the name of Cascade Cold Storage Co., transferred the property from the corporation to the new copartnership, and dissolved the corporation. The Commission's approval of these transfers of public utility property is now sought. There has been no change in warehouse rates or in the service available to the public and none is proposed. Applicants explain that their failure to seek authority to transfer the property at the time of the transactions above referred to was attributable to their lack of knowledge of requirements of the Public Utilities Act (Section No. 51(a)).

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary, and that the application should be granted. Applicants' tariff should be supplemented to show the name under which they are now operating.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above-entitled application be and it is hereby granted.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Paul J. Dalton, Dale West, Mark Evans and Louie Lyon, copartners, shall within sixty (60) days after the effective date hereof and on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public, supplement or reissue their tariff on file with the Commission to show that warehouse operations are being conducted under the name of Cascade Cold Storage Co.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
