IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Application No. 28649 be and the same is hereby reopened for the purpose hereinabove set forth. Said

half, at 10 o'clock a. m., on Tuesday, the 12<sup>th</sup> day  
of June, 1950, in the American Legion  
Hall at Pittsburg, California
