OPINION AND ORDER

By this application L. C. Montgomery, doing business as Crystal Cold Storage Warehouse, seeks authority to transfer public utility warehouse property located at Anaheim to L. C. Montgomery and Carl W. Montgomery, a copartnership.

The verified application shows that L. C. Montgomery has operated the warehouse for many years, that this transfer is proposed due to his ill-health, that Carl W. Montgomery who has acted as manager for some years will continue to manage the business under the partnership arrangements, and that no change is proposed in warehouse rates or in service available to the public.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that L. C. Montgomery may, within sixty (60) days after the effective date hereof, transfer to L. C. Montgomery and Carl W. Montgomery, copartners, the warehouse property involved in this proceeding; that prior to the effective date of said transfer applicants shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public, supplement or reissue tariffs on file

with the Commission insofar as they name rates, rules and regulations governing warehouse operations of L. C. Montgomery at Anaheim to show that L. C. Montgomery has withdrawn or canceled and that L. C. Montgomery and Carl W. Montgomery, copartners, have concurrently adopted or established as their own said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
