ORDER

The Department of Public Works of the State of California is authorized to reconstruct two crossings of State Highway (Routes 119 and 22) at grade with tracks of Southern Pacific Company, (Crossings No. EB-85.9 and No. EB-94.5) near Hollister, San Benito County, as described in the application and in accordance with the plans attached thereto. Width of crossings shall be substantially as shown on said plans and grades of approach shall be not greater than two per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1-A crossing signs. (G. O. No. 75-B) at Crossing No. EB-85.9 and by one Standard No. 1-A sign, one Standard No. 1 sign and one Standard No. 3 wigwag at Crossing No. EB-94.5.

Construction expense shall be apportioned by agreement between the parties or, if they fail to agree, by further order of the Commission. Maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by applicant. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or

safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
