ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By Application No. 30622 Pacific Motor Trucking Company sought a highway common carrier certificate authorizing operations between rail stations on the line of Southern Pacific Company between Los Angeles and Bakersfield via Saugus and Mojave. By Application No. 30644, Southern Pacific Company sought authority to discontinue passenger trains Nos. 55 and 56 between Los Angeles and Fresno. The service proposed by Pacific Motor Trucking Company was designed to handle the head-end traffic of passenger trains Nos. 55 and 56. A public hearing was had on these applications before Commissioner Potter and Examiner Paul at Bakersfield and the matters were submitted for decision.

On May 5, 1950, applicants through counsel requested that these proceedings be dismissed without prejudice stating that the plans to discontinue passenger trains Nos. 55 and 56 between Los Angeles and Fresno had been abandoned. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Applications Nos. 30622 and 30644 are hereby dismissed without projudice.
