SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

In 1949 the Commission ordered applicant herein to cease furnishing service in an area which included Tract No. 15662, known as Towar Subdivision, without first obtaining a certificate therefor. (Pico County Water Dist. v. San Gabriel Valley Water Co., 49 Cal. P.U.C. 65.) In February of 1950 applicant's request for a certificate authorizing service in Towar Subdivision was denied. (San Gabriel Valley Water Co. v. Whittier Water Co., and related matters, 49 Cal. P.U.C. 442.) Applicant now requests reopening and amendment of the latter decision so as to permit applicant to operate in that tract. Upon consideration of applicant's petition, and of the answer thereto filed by Pico County Water District, and being of the opinion that no good cause has been shown for the requested reopening, IT IS ORDERED that the supplemental application filed June 23, 1950, in so far as it pertains to Tract No. 15662, is hereby denied.

By the same pleading applicant requests a certificate authorizing extension of service to Tracts Nos. 16534 and 16765. The filing of such request is consistent with the 1950 decision already mentioned, and in so far as the supplemental application requests a certificate in the latter two tracts, it will be set

for hearing before such presiding officer and at such time and place as may hereafter be designated.

The Secretary is directed to cause copies of this order to be mailed to all appearances in the proceedings in which Decision No. 43857 was issued, and to cause notices of hearing on that portion of the supplemental application relating to Tracts Nos. 16534 and 16765 to be mailed to said appearances at least ten (10) days before such hearing.
