O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct one additional spur track at grade across "M" Street and to relocate an existing spur track across "M" Street and across San Joaquin Street in Newman, Stanislaus County, at the locations described in the application, the crossing with "M" Street to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. BA-119.55-C. San Joaquin Street is unimproved and not open at the point of crossing. Construction of said crossing with "M" Street shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding two per cent. Protection shall be by two existing Standard No. 1 crossing signs(G.O. No. 75-B). Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant states that the industry to be served requires immediate construction of the track and requests that the authority,

if granted, be made effective immediately. For this reason the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
