## SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No.<u>444633</u> entered today in Case No. 4808 established state-wide minimum rates, rules and regulations for the transportation of cement, and for the transportation of lime, cement flue dust, and powdered limestone in mixed shipments with cement when shipped in quantities of 38,000 pounds or more. The rates, rules and regulations partly supersede provisions of City Carriers' Tariff No. 2-A - Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A (Appendix "A" to Decision No. 41362, as amended, in Case 4108). That tariff will be amended accordingly.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 41362, as amended, in Case No. 4108, be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating in City Carriers' Tariff No. 2-A - Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A

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(Appendix "A" to said decision, as amended), to become effective September 15, 1950, Second Revised Page 12 cancels First Revised Page 12, which page is attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that any tariff publications of common carrier respondents in Case No. 4109 filed pursuant to this order may be made effective not earlier than September 15, 1950, on less than thirty (30) but not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

In all other respects Decision No. 41362, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective thirty (30) days after the date hereof.
