ORDER

San Joaquin County is authorized to construct Gertrude

Avenue at grade across the Oakdale Branch of Southern Pacific Company near Stockton in that County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. DC-93.4. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 24 feet and grades of approach not greater than four per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (G. O. No. 75-B), which may be equipped with reflectorizing material.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The crossing is required to afford access to a new school, to be opened next month and applicant requests that the order be

made effective immediately. For this reason the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
