ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Wyatt H. Williams, Jr., holds a city carrier permit. He operates within the City of Vallejo. Under the provisions of General Order No. 84C city carriers may not handle C.O.D. (collect on delivery) shipments until a surety bond of not less than \$2,000 is provided and filed with the Commission. The bonding provisions were established as a measure of protection for shippers. By this application filed July 24, 1950, Williams asks that the Commission "make its order authorizing applicant to postpone obtaining a C.O.D. Bond until such time as any C.O.D. orders require it." Applicant was requested to clarify the application with respect to the authority sought, the circumstances and conditions considered as justifying the desired relief and the position of the shippers involved. He thereupon advised that an amended application would be filed. The amendment has not been submitted. Williams has also failed to respond to several further requests for information regarding the steps being taken toward making such a filing. Accordingly the application will be dismissed for want of prosecution.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above-entitled application be and it is hereby dismissed.
