O P I N I O N

This is an application for an order authorizing WILLIAM BOSTWICK, an individual, doing business as BOSTWICK LUMBER TRANSPORTATION to sell, and AL MATTSON, an individual, to purchase the highway common carrier operative rights granted by Decision No. 43424, in Application No. 29792, dated October 18, 1949 which authorized the transportation of lumber and other forest products between various points in Central and Northern California.

The application shows that under an agreement dated September 20, 1950, the consideration to be paid for the rights involved is the sum of \$2,000. Applicant Mattson has a highway contract carrier permit and transports lumber and other forest products. The application indicates that he possesses the financial ability and operating experience to conduct the service involved herein.

A public hearing is not deemed necessary. We find that approval of the sale will not be adverse to the public interest. The application will be granted.

The action taken herein shall not be construed to be a finding of the value of the operative rights involved.

O R D E R

The Commission having found that the public interest will not be adversely affected,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That William Bostwick after the effective date hereof may sell and transfer to Al Mattson the operative rights described in the foregoing opinion, and said Al Mattson may acquire and thereafter operate the same pursuant to the agreement attached to the application herein.

(2) In the event this authorization to transfer is exercised, Al Mattson shall advise the Commission thereof in writing within 10 days after the actual date of such transfer.

(3) That the authorization herein granted shall expire if not exercised within six (6) months after the effective date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

(4) Applicant shall comply with the provisions of General Order No. 80 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A by filing in triplicate and concurrently making effective appropriate tariffs and timetables within 60 days after the effective date hereof on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
