O R D E R

The City of Sacramento in Application 31755 requests  
✓ authority to construct crossings at 60th Street and 58th Street in  
that city. Since filing the application the city has revised its  
request and has stated that one crossing will meet its immediate  
needs.

City of Sacramento is authorized to construct a crossing  
at grade across 60th Street with Central California Traction  
Company in the City of Sacramento, Sacramento County, at the loca-  
tion described in the application to be identified as Crossing No.  
61-46.1. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also  
maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails.  
Central California Traction Company shall bear maintenance cost be-  
tween such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 24 feet  
and grades of approach not greater than two per cent. Construction  
shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2B of G. O. No. 72.  
Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs. (G.O. No.  
75-B).

Applicant's request for a crossing with the tracks of  
Central California Traction Company at 58th Street in the City of  
Sacramento is hereby dismissed without prejudice.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this  
order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This

authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
