SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By petition filed October 13, 1950, Southern Pacific Company and Pacific Motor Trucking Company seek authority to enlarge their pickup and delivery zones at Cupertino and to apply Cupertino rates to the enlarged territory.

The verified petition shows that the area proposed to be added to the present Cupertino pickup and delivery limits is contiguous to and actually a part of the community; that this area is situated within three miles of the Cupertino post office; and that petitioners desire to provide the same service and rates throughout the community. Because of the relatively short distances involved, deviations from the applicable minimum rates will be slight.

Competing carriers have been notified of the filing of the petition. No objection has been offered to its being granted.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the granting of the sought authority is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that petitioners be and they are hereby authorized to enlarge their pickup and delivery zones at Cupertino, as requested; and to establish for the transportation involved, not earlier than five (5) days after the effective date of this order and on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public, rates no lower than those prescribed for like transportation to and from Cupertino.

The authority herein granted shall expire sixty (60) days after the effective date of this order

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
