FOURTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant transports flour in truckload lots within the City of San Diego for certain bakeries. Prior orders in this proceeding have authorized him to assess rates which are less than the minimum rates otherwise applicable. The authority is scheduled to expire October 29, 1950. Permission thereafter to continue to deviate from the established minimum rates and to observe the present rates for a further one-year period is now sought.

The verified supplemental application shows that in general the conditions surrounding the transportation in question which justified deviation from the minimum rates still obtain; that operations under the authorized rates have been profitable during the past year; and that the continued application of these rates may reasonably be expected to result in profitable operations during the ensuing year.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the sought extension of applicant's authority is justified and should be granted. To prevent a lapse of that authority the order will be made effective October 29, 1950.

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Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted by Decision No. 39572 of October 24, 1946, in this proceeding, as amended, be and it is hereby extended to October 29, 1951, unless sooner changed or further extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective October 29, 1950.
