<u>opinion</u>

In this proceeding Key System Transit Lines requests authority to reroute its No. 42 Naval Air Station passenger line over the following streets:

Along Marshall Way from Third Street to Fourth Street, thence along Pacific Avenue from Fourth Street to Fifth Street, all in the City of Alameda.

The authority to operate over its present route was granted in Decision Nos. 33784, 39264 and 42659 in Application No. 19502.

As justification for the authority sought, applicant alleges that the City of Alameda has recently opened a new street designated as Marshall Way. This street was constructed to reduce traffic congestion along Lincoln Avenue which is part of the route presently used by applicant. Present fares of applicant would be applicable over the proposed new routing.

After full consideration of the facts, the Commission is of the epinion and finds that public convenience and necessity require the proposed rerouting. This is not a matter requiring a public hearing.

ORDER

Application having been made, the Commission being fully informed in the premises and it having been found that public convenience and necessity so require,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

(1) That Key System Transit Lines is hereby granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 2-1/4 of the Public Utilities Act, for the transportation of passengers over the following route:

Beginning at the intersection of Lincoln Avenue and Fifth Street via Marshall Way and Pacific Avenue to Third Street.

This certificate is granted as an extension and enlargement of and consolidated with applicant's present operative rights.

(2) That applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted within a period of not to exceed thirty days from the effective date hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
