ORDER OF REVOCATION

Mary Maritzen and E. B. Osthues herein request the Commission to revoke the certificate of public convenience and necessity (Decision No. 35800 dated September 29, 1942 in Application No. 25232) which authorized them to transport passengers between Modesto and the Hammond General Hospital, now known as Modesto State Hospital.

Applicant alleges that Decision No. 38808 dated April 2, 1946, in Application No. 27183, authorized the suspension of such operative right for a period of six months; that such service was discontinued in April, 1946; that leave to restore such service was denied them by Decision No. 42389 dated December 29, 1948; that pursuant to the provisions of the decision last above mentioned, Willis Kleinenbroich instituted, and now conducts, an adequate passenger stage service between Modesto and Modesto State Hospital.

Now therefore, a public hearing, not being necessary and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 35800 in Application No. 25232, as amended by Decisions Nos. 36486 and 36963 in Application No. 25232, is hereby revoked and annulled.

(2) That within sixty (60) days from the effective date hereof and on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall comply with the provisions of General Orders Nos. 79 and 93A by filing, in triplicate, appropriate cancellation supplements to applicable tariffs and timetables.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
