OPINION AND ORDER

Robert G. Jurs, doing business as Farmers Warehouse Company, operates a public utility warehouse at Hilmar, Merced County. The property on which the business is conducted is leased from A. A. Austerland, who retired from the warehouse business in 1946. By this application Jurs seeks authority to sell the warehouse equipment and business to Gilbert C. McCorkle. Austerland will lease the property to McCorkle. McCorkle proposes no change in the warehouse rates or in the service available to the public.

It appears that this transfer is not adverse to public interest and that a public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Robert G. Jurs may, within sixty (60) days after the effective date hereof, transfer the public utility warehouse property involved in this proceeding to Gilbert C. McCorkle; that, prior to the effective date of said transfer, applicants shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public, supplement or reissue tariffs on file with the Commission insofar as they name rates, rules and regulations governing warehouse operations of Robert G. Jurs at Hilmar to show

that he has withdrawn or canceled and that Gilbert C. McCorkle has concurrently adopted or established as his own said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
