SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2 provides state-wide minimum rates for the transportation of general commodities by highway carriers. The tariff is inapplicable on commodities for which rates are provided in other minimum rate tariffs. These exceptions are listed in Item No. 40 series of Tariff No. 2. At the various times when they were listed, they conformed strictly with the proceeding, decision and tariff numbers and commodity descriptions of the other minimum rate tariffs. Subsequently, new proceedings resulted in amendatory decisions, tariffs were revised or reissued and commodity descriptions changed. In the interest of clarity and uniformity Item No. 40 will be amended so that up-to-date references will be made to other minimum rate tariffs. A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" to Decision No. 31606 as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein Twenty-first Revised Page 14 cancels Twentieth Revised Page 14, which page is attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

This order shall become effective February 1, 1951.
