## <u>O P I N I O N</u>

In this application, filed August 26, 1950, Jesse Costa, doing business as Snelling Water Works in the town of Snelling, Merced County, requests an order authorizing an increase in rates.

A public hearing in this matter was held before Examiner Emerson in Snelling on January 10, 1951, and the record therein consolidated with that made in re Application No. 31860, an application for sale and purchase of the water system.

The present rates of \$1 and \$1.50 per residential service were filed with this Commission on January 29, 1941, and have been effective since January 1, 1941. It is of record that applicant has been charging rates different from those legally on file for five customers during the year 1949 and for six customers during the year 1950. In addition, applicant's books show that no charge has been made for water supplied to applicant's garage and tavern. Such irregular practices must cease. Applicant's request for increased rates does not specifically set forth a rate schedule proposal but indicates charges ranging from \$1.50 per month to \$6 per month on a flat rate basis. No meter rates are requested.

The Snelling Water Works consists of a shallow well, a centrifugal pump, a 1,000-gallon pressure tank, and approximately

3,200 feet of distribution mains which vary in size from 3/4 inch to 3 inches in diameter. Approximately 37 customers are served, including three service connections and one fire hydrant for the County of Merced and also including service to applicant's garage and tavern. It appears that somewhat less than one-half the town is now served and that there are, therefore, about an equal number of additional potential customers.

At the hearing, applicant indicated that actual and estimated expenses and revenues as set forth in the application were true and correct and constituted his entire showing in the matter. He further indicated that Commission engineers had investigated his operations and had examined his books, and that their report was fully acceptable to him. Full reliance will, therefore, be placed upon the study of staff engineer John D. Reader entered as Exhibit No. 3 in this proceeding.

The fixed capital of this water system, depreciation expenses, and depreciation reserve requirements appear to be as follows:

It is apparent that this utility is experiencing a substantially declining rate of return and that applicant is entitled to relief in the form of increased rates. No objection to the granting of increased rates as proposed by applicant has been entered in this proceeding. The rates to be authorized herein will provide an estimated rate of return of approximately 6.4%. To the extent that the present rates differ from the rates hereinafter prescribed, said existing rates are hereby found to be unjust and unreasonable.

## O R D E R

Jesse Costa (Snelling Water Works) having applied to this Commission for an order authorizing increases in rates and charges, a public hearing having been held, the matter having been submitted and being now ready for decision,

IT IS HEREBY FOUND AS A FACT that the increases in rates and charges authorized herein are justified; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Jesse Costa (Snelling Water Works) is authorized and directed to file the schedule of rates shown in Exhibit A attached to this order on or after the effective date
