FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant conducts operations as a passenger stage corporation between certain points in San Bernardino and Riverside Counties. By Decision No. 44685 of August 22, 1950, in this proceeding, he was authorized to make certain adjustments in his fares. He failed to file the authorized adjustments in his tariff within the time limit of the decision. By supplemental application filed February 16, 1951, he now seeks authority to make the necessary tariff filings on five days' notice, as well as relief from the Commission's tariff filing requirements insofar as they direct that each tariff change be indicated by a designated symbol.

Applicant alleges that his failure to make the proper tariff filings was unintentional and that it resulted from lack of knowledge and understanding of the Commission's tariff filing requirements. He further alleges that designating each of the numerous fare changes would unduly complicate his tariff. In general rate or fare adjustments such as that involved here exemption from designating the changes is ordinarily granted.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the sought authority is justified and should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that applicant be and he is hereby authorized to make the tariff filings covering the adjustments in fares found justified in Decision No. 44685 of August 22, 1950, in this proceeding, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, and to depart from the terms of Rule 4(n) of General Order No. 79, in making such filings.

The authority herein granted shall expire sixty (60) days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
