FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

On March 30, 1951, a petition was filed by Lester J. Geijsbeek and John H. Geijsbeek, a co-partnership, doing business as Geijsbeek Truckers for a modification of Decision No. 45094, dated December 5, 1950, issued in Application No. 31682 requesting an extension of time in which to comply with the provisions of General Orders Nos. 80 and 93-A (Part IV) concerning the filing in triplicate and concurrently making effective tariffs and time schedules satisfactory to the Commission.

The petitioner alleges that in order to meet rail competitive rates as authorized in the original order it is necessary to make such rates on a point to point basis; that there are an exceedingly large number of points involved in the territory to be served; that because of the great number of individual rates which must be published it has been impossible to complete the preparation of a tariff meeting the requirements of the original order within the time provided. The petitioner has requested that the time for compliance be extended to one hundred fifty (150) days. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That paragraph (2) (b) of the order in Decision No. 45094 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Applicants shall, within one hundred fifty (150) days after the effective date of this order and upon not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, establish the service herein authorized and comply with provisions of General Orders Nos. 80 and 93-A (Part IV), by filing, in triplicate and concurrently making effective tariffs and time schedules satisfactory to the Commission."

(2) That in all other respects the order in Decision No. 45094 shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
