ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY INTERIM RELIEF

Clem F. Neveaux having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that he is a film technician residing at 6219 Lexington Avenue, Apartment 7, Los Angeles, California, and has been a subscriber of telephone service at that address for the past eight years; that on February 22, 1950, his telephone was disconnected by the Hollywood vice squad, the reason being that complainant's ex-roommate was using the telephone for illegal booking; that at the time complainant was unaware that his telephone was being used for illegal booking, and that complainant's ex-room-mate has admitted that complainant knew nothing of said ex-room-mate's undertakings; that complainant is an employee of a motion picture corporation and is frequently on call for work beyond his regular hours; and that with the loss of his telephone complainant has been socially embarrassed and has had several financial losses; therefore

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company is hereby directed to restore telephone service to complainant pending hearing on said complaint and further Commission order thereon.

Hearing on the complaint shall be had before such Commissioner or Examiner and at such time and place as may hereafter be designated.

The Secretary is directed to cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be served forthwith upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its reply to said complaint within ten (10) days after such service.

The Secretary is directed further as follows:

- 1. To cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainant.
- 2. To cause notices of hearing to be mailed to complainant and defendant at least ten (10) days before the hearing herein.
