THIRTEENTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Applicants transport lumber and other forest products for the Owens-Parks Lumber Company from Vernon to points within a 30-mile radius of that city. They have been authorized to deviate from the established minimum rates by prior orders in this proceeding. This authority expires June 25, 1951. Applicants now seek authority thereafter to deviate from the minimum rates and to continue to observe their present rates for a further one-year period.

The verified supplemental application shows that the conditions which now surround the transportation in question are similar to the conditions which justified previous deviation from the minimum rates; that operations under the authorized rates have been profitable; and that the continued application of these rates may reasonably be expected to result in profitable operations for the ensuing year.

It appears that the sought authority is justified and should be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted by Decision No. 38032 of June 26, 1945, as amended,

in this proceeding, be and it is hereby extended to June 26, 1952, unless sooner changed or further extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
