OPINION AND ORDER

The above-entitled investigation of the operating rights, operations and practices of Richard Van Hoosear, doing business as Consolidated Milling Company, was instituted because respondent had a public utility warehouse tariff applicable at San Francisco on file with the Commission and it appeared that he might not be performing public warehouse service thereunder.

Public hearing of the matter was held at San Francisco on August 29, 1951, before Examiner Lake.

Respondent was regularly served with a copy of the order instituting the investigation and with a notice of the hearing. He did not appear. However, he advised the Commission by letter that he had not provided public utility warehouse service for many years. He requested that his operating rights be canceled. No other evidence was submitted.

In the circumstances, the operating rights involved should be revoked, respondent's tariff canceled, and the proceeding discontinued.


Therefore, good cause appearing,


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that whatever operating rights respondent, Richard Van Hoosear, doing business as Consolidated Milling Company, may possess to engage in the public utility warehouse business in the City and County of San Francisco be and they are hereby revoked, and that respondent's Warehouse Tariff C.R.C. No. 5 be and it is hereby canceled.


IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that this investigation be and it is hereby discontinued.


This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
