SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER AND ORDER EXTENDING TIME

In this application the Department of Public Works of the State of California alleges that certain minor changes have been made in the original plans and requests authority to relocate flashing light signals authorized by Public Utilities Commission Decision No. 42856, dated May 10, 1949. Applicant also requests an extension of time alleging that with the additional work which will be required as hereinabove described it will not be possible to complete the installation by December 31, 1951; however, it is expected that the project will be completed by June 30, 1952.

Good Cause Appearing, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Department of Public Works is authorized to relocate the Standard No. 8 flashing light signals authorized by said Decision No. 42856 to conform to Exhibit "B" attached to and made a part of applicant's Petition for Extension of Time and for Authority to Relocate Flashing Light Signals, filed September 5, 1951. Expense of additional work occasioned by change of plans shall be borne in accordance with the terms of a supplemental construction agreement between applicant and railroad. Should the parties fail to agree the Commission will allocate such costs by subsequent order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the time limit within which applicant may complete the project authorized by said Decision No. 42856 be and it is hereby extended to June 30, 1952.

In all other respects Decision No. 42856 is in full force and effect.
