FIFTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant transports flour in truckload lots within the City of San Diego for certain bakeries. Prior orders in this proceeding have authorized him to assess rates which are less than the minimum rates otherwise applicable. The authority is scheduled to expire October 29, 1951. Permission thereafter to continue to deviate from the established minimum rates for a further one-year period, and to observe the present authorized basis as modified by an upward adjustment of the accessorial charge for delivery beyond ground floor, including stacking, is now sought.

The verified supplemental application shows that, except for a wage increase, the conditions surrounding the transportation in question which justified deviation from the minimum rates still obtain; that the proposed advance in accessorial charges offsets the wage adjustment; that operations under the present authorized rates have been profitable during the past year; and that the continued application of these rates as modified herein may reasonably be expected to result in profitable operations during the ensuing year.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the sought extension of applicant's authority is justified and should be granted. To prevent a lapse of the authority the order will be made effective October 29, 1951.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Appendix "A" of Decision No. 39572 of October 24, 1946, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby amended by substituting the following in place of paragraph (4) of Item No. 40 thereof: "For delivery beyond tailgate at other than street level, including stacking, two cents per 100 pounds"; and that the expiration date of said Decision No. 39572, as amended, be and it is hereby extended to October 29, 1952, unless sooner changed or further extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective October 29, 1951.
