ORDER

The Department of Public Works of the State of California is authorized to construct a county road at grade across the Coast Line of Southern Pacific Company as a connection from Padaro Lane to State Highway V-SB-2-J near Carpinteria, Santa Barbara County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. E-378.2. Construction expense shall be borne in accordance with terms of an agreement entered into between the Department of Public Works and the railroad, and a copy of said agreement shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction by further order. Maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by the County of Santa Barbara. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 24 feet and grades of approach not greator than four per cent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1-A crossing signs, General Order No. 75-B.

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Upon completion of Crossing No. E-378.2 and upon its being opened to public use, Crossing No. E-378.3, located about one-tenth mile to the east, shall be abandoned and closed.

Within thirty (30) days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one (1) year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
