SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By petition filed November 29, 1951, the rail lines and Pacific Motor Trucking Company ask for postponement of the January 1, 1952 effective date of Decisions Nos. 46022, 46026 and 46028 of July 31, 1951, and various amendments thereto, in the above-entitled proceeding, and for postponement of the effective date of tariff publications required by such decisions until June 30, 1952. These decisions establish revised constructive highway mileages.

Petitioners represent that, although they have had a substantial staff engaged in the necessary tariff revisions since August, only about one-fourth of the task has been completed. Amendatory decisions, they state, have further delayed the work.

Petitioners confine their requests to the general commodity and the bulk petroleum and petroleum products tariffs. They rely solely upon their need for additional time in which to make the tariff filings. Decision No. 46486 of December 4, 1951, postponed the application of the revised mileages insofar as the petroleum tariff is concerned.

Replies to the petition were submitted on behalf of numerous other common carriers. These carriers object to any postponement of the effective date of the new distance table. They point out that

their revised tariffs have been filed with the Commission pursuant to outstanding orders, that these tariffs are not confined to the general commodity rates covered by the rail line petition, and that similar tariff filings have been made with the Interstate Commerce Commission for application to interstate traffic. They assert that although both increases and reductions in rates are involved in connection with the revised mileages the reductions predominate, and that postponement of the effective date of the revised mileages as sought by the rail lines would deprive shippers of the benefits of the prescribed reductions. They assert further that the proposed postponement would subject them to substantial additional expense in compiling, publishing and filing the further tariff changes which would thus be made necessary. They do not oppose petitioners being granted an extension of time in which to complete their tariff revisions.

There is no showing of a need for postponement of the January 1, 1952 effective date for any respondents other than the petitioners. Nor would radial highway common or contract carriers be disadvantaged by the granting of relief to petitioners since permitted highway carriers are authorized to observe common carrier rates when such rates are lower than the minimum rates. Other common carriers may, under the same provisions, establish such lower rates in their own tariffs on statutory notice, or may seek authority to establish them on shorter notice.

In the circumstances, it appears that petitioners should be granted an extension of time in which to file their tariff amendments, as requested. A change in the effective date of Distance Table No. 4 has not been justified.

A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that petitioners be and they are hereby authorized to defer until a date not later than June 30, 1952, the filing of revisions to tariffs named in the petition pursuant to Decisions Nos. 46022 and 46028 of July 31, 1951, and Decisions Nos. 46434, 46435 and 46436 of November 20, 1951; and that in all other respects the petition of the rail lines and Pacific Motor Trucking Company, filed November 29, 1951, be and it is hereby denied.

This order shall become effective December 24, 1951.
