In the Matter of the Application of MERCHANTS EXPRESS CORPORATION, a corporation, for authority to establish joint rates with EL DORADO TRANSPORTATION COMPANY.

OPINION AND ORDER

Applicants are highway common carriers of general commodities. Merchants Express Corporation operates in the territory generally bounded by Healdsburg, Calistoga, Redding, Sacramento, Stockton, Livermore and San Jose. El Dorado Transportation Company operates between Sacramento, on the one hand, and Lincoln, Fresh Pond (cast of Placerville), Ione, and Jackson, on the other. By this application, filed under Section 1066 of the Public Utilities Code, Merchants and El Dorado seck authority to establish joint rates between points served by Merchants, excluding Sacramento, and points north and east of Sacramento served by El Dorado.

The rates proposed to be established are the same as the minimum class rates named in Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2, except that rates equivalent to the 5th class through Class E truckload rates of Tariff No. 2 would not be maintained. Authority is also cought to depart from the long and short haul provisions of the Constitution and of the Public Utilities Act to the extent necessary to establish the proposed rates.

Service over applicants' lines between the points involved is now subject to combinations of their local rates. These combination rates, applicants represent, are unreasonably high. They assert

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that establishment of the sought basis would adjust their rates to reasonable levels and would enable them to provide expeditious and conomical service.

Competing carriers have been notified of the filing of the application. No objections have been received.

It appears that the establishment of joint rates as proposed is not adverse to the public interest and is justified. The application will be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that applicants be and they are hereby authorized, within sixty (60) days after the effective date of this order, to establish the joint through highway common carrier rates proposed in the above-entitled application and to depart from the provisions of Article XII, Section 21 of the Constitution of the State of California and Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to establish the rates authorized herein.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
