<u>O P I N I O N</u>

San Joaquin Telephone Company has filed this application for an order authorizing it to execute a mortgage and to issue a promissory note in the principal amount of \$150,000 for the purpose of paying indebtedness and of financing the cost of additions and betterments to its plants and properties.

Applicant is a California corporation organized on February 9, 1923. Since its organization it has been engaged in operating a telephone system in the City of Manteca and recently, pursuant to authority granted by Decision No. 46123, dated August 28, 1951, extended its operations through the acquisition of the telephone system in the City of Ripon. Applicant reports that the continuing growth in its exchange areas has made necessary the expansion of its facilities to meet increasing demends for telephone service. It sets forth in the application that during the year 1950 there was a net gain of 188 stations in the Manteca exchange and 37 stations in the Ripon exchange, and that during the first 11 months of 1951 there was a further gain of 166 stations in Manteca and of 82 stations in Ripon.

The application shows that applicant now desires to improve and extend its facilities further and that it contemplates additional

expenditures amounting to \$272,400, for the following purposes:

It appears that applicant is undertaking the sale of \$120,000 of its preferred stock, the issue of which was authorized by Decisions No. 45723 and No. 46470, to meet in part these estimated expenditures, and that it has made arrangements to borrow from Stockton Savings and Loan Bank the sum of \$150,000 to complete its financing.

The sum proposed to be borrowed from Stockton Savings and Loan Bank will be represented by a note payable in monthly installments of \$312.50, or more, with final payment, however, on January 1, 1962, and with interest at the rate of 5% per annum on deforred payments. The note will be secured by a mortgage of chattels covering applicant's personal property.

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In Exhibit A-3 applicant reports its operating revenues for the first ton months of 1951 at \$167,833.21 and its net operating income at \$19,585.76 after making provision for depreciation in the amount of \$10,991.06. It reports its pro forma balance sheet giving effect to the issue of the note and certain sales of real property, now in progress, as of October 31, 1951, as follows:

A review of the application and of applicant's financial reports indicates that its earnings should be ample to enable it to meet the requirements under the proposed note issue. It clearly appears that applicant will have need for the proceeds from the issue of said note for the purposes indicated, and that, accordingly, an order should be entered granting its request.

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The Commission having considered the above entitled matter, and being of the opinion that a public hearing thereon is not necessary; that the application should be granted, as herein provided; that the money, property or labor to be procured or paid for through the issue of the note herein authorized is reasonably required by applicant for the purposes specified herein; and that such purposes are not, in whole or in part, reasonably chargeable to operating expenses or to income; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:


1. San Joaquin Telephone Company, after the effective date hercof and on or before June 30, 1952, may execute a mortgage of chattels and issue a note in the principal amount of not exceeding \$150,000 for the purposes indicated in this application. The note and mortgage of chattels shall be in, or substantially in, the same form as those filed in this proceeding and identified as Exhibit B.

2. Applicant shall file with the Commission monthly reports as required by General Order No. 24-A, which order, insofar as applicable, is made a part of this order.

3. The authority herein granted will become effective when applicant has paid the fee prescribed by Section 1904 of the Public Utilities Code, which fee is one hundred fifty (\$150.00) dollars.
