O R D E R

It now appearing that the Interstate Commerce Commission in Docket No. MC-F-4754 has authorized Lillie Transportation Company, Inc. to convey all its assets, except only its real property and cash to William Miles and Pat L. Nolet, and applicants herein having requested that this Commission's Decision No. 45324, dated January 30, 1951, be amended in conformity therewith,

Now therefore, IT IS ORDERED that Decision No. 45324, dated January 30, 1951, is amended as follows:

(1) Lillie Transportation Company, Inc., pursuant to its request is made a party herein.

(2) Lillie Transportation Company, Inc. after the effective date hereof, and on or before March 25, 1952, may sell and transfer to W. W. Miles and Pat L. Nolet, copartners doing business as Miles & Sons Trucking Service, its certificates of public convenience and necessity and property, excepting only its real property and cash, and the latter may purchase the same.

(3) Wilbur Lillie and Everett Lillie, copartners doing business as Lillie Transportation Company, after the effective date hereof, and on or before March 25, 1952, may sell and transfer to W. W. Miles and Pat L. Nolet, who may acquire, the automotive equipment referred to herein.

(4) The sale and transfer permitted by paragraphs (2) and (3) hereof, shall be made in accordance with the terms of the amended agreement attached to the second supplemental application as Exhibit "H".

In all other respects Decision No. 45324 shall remain in full force and effect.
