OPINION AND ORDER

By this application Southern Pacific Milling Company seeks authority to sell and Laurence A. Hearne and Irene C. Hearne seek authority to purchase public utility warehouse property and equipment located at Greenfield, Monterey County, for a cash consideration of \$125,000. Laurence A. Hearne is an experienced warehouseman. No change is proposed in the warehouse rates or in the service available to the public.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

The action taken herein shall not be construed to be a finding of the value of the property herein authorized to be transferred.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Milling Company may, within sixty (60) days after the effective date hereof, transfer to Laurence A. Hearne and Irene C. Hearne the warehouse property involved in this proceeding; that prior to the effective date of said transfer applicants shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public, supplement or reissue tariffs on file with the Commission insofar as they name rates,

rules and regulations governing warehouse operations of the Southern Pacific Milling Company at Greenfield to show that Southern Pacific Milling Company has withdrawn or canceled and that Laurence A. Hearne and Irene C. Hearne have concurrently adopted or established as their own said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
