SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By petition filed February 21, 1952, Southern Pacific Company and Pacific Motor Trucking Company seek authority to enlarge their pickup and delivery zone at Paso Robles and to apply Paso Robles rates to the enlarged territory.

The verified petition shows that the purpose of the petition is to include the newly established Paso Robles School for Boys within the Paso Robles pickup and delivery zone; that the school is situated within three miles of the corporate limits; and that all other similarly situated areas contiguous to Paso Robles where there is a demand for pickup and delivery service are within the existing zone. Because of the relatively short distances involved, deviations from the established minimum rates would be slight. From the points where the school is expected to obtain its major supplies, the minimum rates to the school site are the same as the Paso Robles rates.

Competing carriers have been notified of the filing of the petition. No objection has been offered to its being granted.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the granting of the sought authority is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that petitioners be and they are hereby authorized to enlarge their pickup and delivery zone at Paso Robles, as requested; and to establish for the transportation involved, not earlier than five (5) days after the effective date of this order and on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public, rates no lower than those prescribed for like transportation to and from Paso Robles.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within sixty (60) days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
