In the Matter of the Application of PACIFIC GREYHOUND LINES for installation of "Exemption Signs" at Railroad Crossings where motor vehicles carrying passengers for hire need not stop, in accordance with Section No. 576 (d) of the California Vehicle Code and G. O. No. 98 of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California in the vicinity of Patterson.

ORDER

The railroad involved having waived protest, IT IS ORDERED that approval is hereby granted for the display of distinctive "exempt signs" as provided in Vehicle Code Section 576 (d), at the crossing with spur track in the vicinity of Patterson, Stanislaus County, Crossing No. BA-110.1-C.

Said signs shall comply with the requirements of Part 16 of the Commission's General Order No. 98 and shall be erected and maintained by the proper authorities. If either sign is removed, or the view thereof obstructed, vehicles carrying passengers for hire must come to a full stop before passing over the crossing. Within 30 days after erection of such signs applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This approval does not exempt any vehicle operator from the observance of any provision of the Vehicle Code, and shall become void if signs are not displayed within one year, or if above conditions are not complied with. Approval may be revoked

or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
