This is an application filed pursuant to the provisions of paragraph 6 of the Commission's General Order No. 101 for approval of certificates of insurance issued by Cravens, Dargan & Company providing insurance coverage for Horace Coniglio by Lloyd's of London.

Horace Coniglio, doing business as Coniglio Auto Stage, is engaged in business as a carrier of passengers by motor coach in and about Pittsburg, Contra Costa County. To meet his obligations for personal liability and property damage, he has obtained certificates of insurance, copies of which have been filed with the Commission, providing for primary insurance coverage with Lloyd's in the amounts of \$10,000 and \$20,000 for personal injuries and in the amount of \$10,000 for property damage, and for excess liability up to \$15,000 and \$80,000 for personal liability. The certificates are dated April 25, 1952, and cover the period from February 19, 1952, to February 19, 1953.

It appears that applicant uses one bus in his operations, and that his operating revenue for 1951 amounted to \$2,326.45, his operating expenses to \$945.30 including premiums for insurance, injuries and damages in the sum of approximately \$240, and his net

income to \$945.30. The application shows that there were no claims filed for damages during the last three years and there are no claims now pending.

In our opinion the certificates of insurance obtained by applicant should afford security for the protection of the public, as contemplated by the general order.

ORDER

The Commission having considered the above entitled matter, and being of the opinion that a public hearing thereon is not necessary and that an order should be entered granting applicant's request; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

1. The Commission hereby approves the certificates of insurance, dated April 25, 1952, and the endorsements, issued by Cravens, Dargan & Company providing for insurance coverage for Horace Coniglio by Lloyd's of London, and a renewal, or renewals, of said certificates.

2. This order is effective upon the date hereof.
