ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHT

It appearing by Commission Decision No. 41716, dated June 15, 1948, in the above proceeding, that Charles Nash was authorized to establish and operate a service as a passenger stage corporation for the transportation of passengers and baggage within Santa Maria and between Santa Maria, Orcutt, Betteravia, Guadalupe, Mayer Tract and intermediate points; that no evidence of adequate protection against liability imposed by law for the payment of damages for personal injury or property damage has been filed with the Commission by said Charles Nash, as required by General Order No. 101; and that the passenger stage service in question has been discontinued for a substantial period of time without any authorization to suspend or discontinue such operations; therefore, it is found that Charles Nash is no longer conducting and has abandoned said passenger stage operation.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate issued to Charles Nash by Decision No. 41716 in this proceeding is hereby revoked

and all effective tariffs and time tables on file in the name of Charles Nash are hereby cancelled.

The Secretary is directed to cause a certified copy of this order to be served upon Charles Nash.

The effective date of this order shall be the twentieth (20th) day after service of a copy hereof upon Charles Nash, unless said Charles Nash before such effective date shall have filed with this Commission a written response to this order, denying the facts set forth herein and requesting a public hearing thereon, in which event the effective date of this order will thereby be stayed until hearing is had and further order issued.
