O P I N I O N

Fred Meinert requests authority to discontinue passenger stage service between Yreka and Hornbrook, Grey Eagle Mine, Orleans and intermediate points, via Happy Camp. The right to operate between such points was acquired pursuant to the provisions of Decision No. 43667, dated January 4, 1950, in Application No. 30828.

Applicant alleges that he has been rendering the service at a loss from the time of its acquisition; that he does not possess sufficient financial resources to maintain such service; that he discontinued such service on May 26, 1952.

The circumstances here shown justify granting the application. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

An application having been filed and good cause appearing,
IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That Fred Meinert is authorized to discontinue all service between Yreka and Hornbrook, Grey Eagle Mine, Orleans and intermediate points, via Happy Camp, and the operating authority therefor acquired by Decision No. 43667, dated January 4, 1950, is cancelled and annulled.

(2) That all effective tariffs and time tables on file with the Commission in applicant's name are cancelled as of the effective date hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
