ORDER

The Sacramento Northern Railway, a corporation, on July 26, 1952, applied for authority to construct an industrial lead track at grade across an industrial lead track operated by The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway Company in the vicinity of Pittsburg, County of Contra Costa, State of California. The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway Company has consented in writing to the construction of said crossing at grade across this industrial lead track. It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein; that it is neither reasonable nor practicable at this time to provide a grade separation or to avoid a grade crossing at the point mentioned; and, that the application should be granted, subject to certain conditions:

IT IS ORDERED that Sacramento Northern Railway is authorized to construct an industrial lead track at grade over and across an industrial lead track operated by The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway Company in the vicinity of Fittsburg, County of Contra Costa, State of California, at the location more particularly described in the application and as shown by the map entitled "Exhibit A" attached thereto, subject to the following conditions:

(1) The entire expense of constructing and thereafter maintaining the crossing in first class condition for safe and convenient railway use shall be borne by the Sacramento Northern Railway in accordance with an agreement approved by this Commission, a certified copy of which shall be filed within six (6) months after the date of this order.
