SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. <u>47567</u>, entered today in this proceeding, makes certain revisions in the minimum rates, rules and regulations which have been established heretofore for the transportation of property for motion picture studios and extends the application of the rates to transportation for television studios.

The rates, rules and regulations partly supersede provisions of Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" to Decision No. 31606, as amended, in Case No. 4246). That tariff will be amended accordingly.
