ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY INTERIM RELIEF

ANDREW LOCOCO, of 4334 West Imperial Highway, Inglewood, California, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that prior to August of 1950 a lessee of complainant was a subscriber and user of telephone service furnished by defendant under number OR 73369, which was an extension service of that furnished by defendant to complainant, such extension being at 4338 West Imperial Highway, Lennox, Los Angeles County, California; that during the summer of 1950 the telephone facilities of complainant's lessee were disconnected upon request of the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Office because of suspected bookmaking activities at 4338 West Imperial Highway; that defendant has refused to restore said telephone facilities; that complainant did not use and does not now intend to use said telephone facilities as an instrumentality to violate any law, nor in aiding or abetting such violation; and that complainant has suffered and will suffer irreparable injury and great hardship to his business and reputation as a result of being deprived of said telephone facilities, in that complainant has expanded his restaurant and cocktail lounge and facilities and requires a line for use by the kitchen department without interfering with commercial activ-

ity in other parts of the building; therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company is hereby directed to restore telephone service to complainant pending hearing on said complaint or further Commission order thereon, such service to be furnished pursuant to defendant's filed tariff rates and rules applicable thereto. The complaint will be set for hearing before such Commissioner or Examiner, and at such time and place, as may hereafter be designated.

The Secretary is directed as follows:

1. To cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be served upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its reply to said complaint within ten (10) days after such service.

2. To cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainant.

3. To cause appropriate notice of hearing to be mailed to the parties at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing herein.
