3EFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF TEE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of DON E. HAWKEY, COing business as BhWKEY TRANSPORTATION, for a certificate of public convonience and necessity to extend his highway comon carrier operations.

## OPINION:

Applicant presentiy operates as a higinway comon carrier botwoen San Francisco Bay points, Redding and Sacramento, on the one hand, and on the other hand, points on U. S. Elghway 299 oast of Rodeing, to and inciuding fituras, end to points on said highway west of Redding to the Eurcke arca under authomity of this (1)

Commsaion. Appifcant also transports Lumber and forest produote over extensive routes in Califomia granted in Decision No. 45016 catec November 21, 2950, in kpplications Nos. 31421 and 3146.7 and Decision No. 43424 dated october 28, 1949 in kppiseations Nos. 29680, 29762, 29763, 29892, 29936 and 29965.

By the application berein a cortificate of public convenience and necessity is requested authomizing him to transport, as a highay comon carrier as derined in Section 213 of the pubiic Utilities code, general comodities between the following.points and placos:
(a) Botweon the intersection near Bunney :or T. S. Híqway No. 297 and Stato Highway No. 89 and Burney Felis, via State Fíghoy No. 89, serving all intermediate points and all pointo and places within fifteen (15) miles of Bumncy Falls. AIzO, betweon tho intersoction near Burney of J.'S. Eighway No. 299 and an unnumorod highway and Bunnoy Falls, via said unnumored higinway.
(b) Betwoon the intersection ncan Hillcrest of T. S. Highway No. 299 and unumbered ifgway and Big Bend, via said unnumered bighway sorving ali intemediato pointe and ali points within:15 milos of Big Bond.
(1) Decision No. 46974 dated Apmil 8, 2952 in Applicetion No. 33213.

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Said proposed operation'1s roquezted as on oxtension of the present sorvice provided by applicant so that he will bo authorizod to provide highway comon carrier service on those requosted routes and between said pointa on the one hand, and points on mpplicant's present routes, on the other hand. Applicant alleges that he has a large fleet of motor vehicle equipment sufifolent for the proposed servico. He will, ho states, generaliy charge the rates and observe the rulos and regulations containod In Highway Carriers Tarifi No. 2. There is no common carrier serving the aroa except that McCloud River Railroad may serve one or moro points in tho area proposed but not at any point at which conctruction work will toke place for the paciric Ges \& Electric Company as heresnaiter mentioned. Copy of the application was sorvod on 3aid railroad company soptomber 3, 2952.
A. fustification for granting tho application it. 1s alleged that:

Pacific Gas \& Electric Company is undortaking a substantial hycro-oloctric project, known as pit No. 4 Projoct. This projoct will result in the oxponditure of approximetoly ton milifon coliars and is schoduled for completion in 2955. Work is expected to comence immediately. In addition to shipmonts moving for the Pacific Gas \& Eloctric Company to this projoct, a substantial volumo of traific will move to tho projoct arca for contractorsn camps will bo ostablished, not only in tho project area, but also in tho outiying radial area beroin appisoc for. There is no existing sorvice avaliabio to the project aroa or its vicinity; or to the points on tho routos applied for. Applicant at presont oporatos as a highay comon corrion sorving points on U. S. Highway 299 transponting froight to and from Redding, tho San Francisco Bay area, and the Sacremento aron. Applweant's scrvico f's the only highway comon carrier service on J. S. Highway 299. Applicant as, therofore, tho Logical carrion to porform the
proposed service since be can reach the project area, by obtaining short extensions to his operating authority.

It is further alleged that:
Since the project will require the astablishment of selfsustaining camps for the men working on the project and their families, all comodities for their physicel well-betmg will necessarily have to be transported. In adiztion, of course, there will be numerous shipments of comodities for the project itsele. Also there is no service on the routes proposed to be served. The public is required to travel to points on U. S. Highway 299 served by applicant to obtain their shipments. Establishment of the prom posed service will permit dinoct store-door delivery.

The Commission finds that wublic convenience and necessity require the proposed service. A public hearing is unnecessary.

## ORDER

Application therefor having been filed, the Commission being fully advised in the premises and having found that pubile convenience and necessity so require,

IT IS ORDERED:
(2) That a certificate of public convenience and necessity be, and it hereby is, granted to Don H. Hawkey, doing basiness as Hawkey Transportation authorizing the establishment and operation Of service as a highway common carriex as that term is defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code for the transportation of property consisting of generai commodities (a) between the intersection near Burney of U. S. Highway 299 and State Highway No. 89 and Burney Falls, via State Highway No. 89 serving all intermediate points and all points and places within fifteen (15) miles of Eurney Felis and via unnubered highway botween the intersection near Burney of U. S. Highway No. 299 and sajd unnumbered highway
and Burney Falls all in California, and (b) between the intersection near Hillerest of U. S. Highway No. 299 and unnumbered highway and Big Bend via said unnumbered highway serving ail intermediate points and all points and places within fifteen (15) miles of Big Bend as an extension of, and to be consolidated with his operative rights heretofore granted by this Commission.
(2) That in providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
(a) Within thirty (30) days after the effective date hereof applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted.
(b) Within sixty (60) days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than in e (5) days. notice to the commission and the public, applycant shall establish the service herein authorzed and file appropriate tariffs.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days after the date hereof
