SIXTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant has been authorized to deviate from the established minimum rates in connection with the transportation of flour in truckload lots within the City of San Diego. The authority is scheduled to expire October 29, 1952. Permission is now sought to continue to deviate from the minimum rates for a further one-year period.

The verified supplemental application alleges that, except for increased wage costs, the conditions surrounding the transportation in question which have justified deviation from the minimum rates still obtain; that the higher wage costs have been offset by the use of mechanical means to assist in the unloading; that the transportation is being performed under the most ideal and efficient conditions; that operations under the authorized rates have been profitable; and that the continued application of these rates may reasonably be expected to result in profitable operations during the ensuing year.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the sought extension of applicant's authority is justified and should be granted. To prevent a lapse of applicant's authority the order herein will be made effective October 29, 1952.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted D. J. Glardon, doing business as Arrow Transfer, by Decision No. 39572 of October 24, 1946, as amended, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby extended to October 29, 1953, unless sooner changed or further extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective October 29, 1952.
