In the matter of application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY for an order authorizing the construction at grade of industrial drill track across Washington Avenue in the City of Bakersfield, County of Kern, State of California

O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct an industrial drill track at grade across Washington Avenue in the vicinity of Bakersfield, Kern County, erroneously described in the application as in the City of Bakersfield, to be identified as Crossing No. BT-314.82-C. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G.O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the avenue now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding 2 per cent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1A crossing signs (G. O. No. 75-B). Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
