<u>O P I N I O N</u>

Mountain Properties, Inc., a corporation, by the aboveentitled application filed October 7, 1952, seeks authority to increase its rates for water service in its Independence Square system by about \$926 per year. The application was amended at the hearing by the filing of a request to establish a rate for fire hydrant service.

A public hearing in this matter was held before Examiner Warner on December 10, 1952, in Los Angeles. General Information

Applicant furnishes public utility water service in 19 localities in Los Angeles, Orange, San Bornardino and Kern Counties. Its headquarters are located in Los Angeles. A local collection office is maintained at 13344 Rosecrans Avenue for the convenience of consumers, and a general warehouse and maintenance headquarters is located near Santa Ana.

Operations in Independence Square System

Applicant furnishes domestic and commercial water service to 152 flat rate and 18 meterod consumers in unincorporated territory situated in the vicinity of Rosecrans Avenue and Carmenita Road, Los Angeles County. Such water service has been furnished since 1938 at which time applicant's present rates were established by the Commission. The growth of the area is static and applicant's need for an increase in rates is based on its showing of operating losses in this system for the recorded year 1951 and the estimated year 1952.

Rates

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The following tabulation is a summary of applicant's present and proposed flat rates:

The company's estimate of operating expenses for the year 1952 includes prorated amounts for general expenses based upon the ratio of the number of consumers in Independence Square " system to the total consumers of the company. The Commission staff estimate for 1952 includes amounts prorated on a revenue

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basis. The staff method of proration will be adopted for the purpose of this proceeding in this instance.

Conclusion

It is evident that applicant is in need of financial relief in its Independence Square system and the proposed rates, which are considered to be reasonable, will be authorized to be filed by the order which follows, except that the filing of a different schedule of minimum charges from those proposed by applicant will be authorized. The filing of monthly rates of \$1 for each single outlet fire hydrant and \$2 for each double outlet fire hydrant will also be authorized.

Service Complaints

All consumer appearances protested the granting of this application because of frequent interruptions to water service and sand and oil in their water service pipe lines. Applicant's president testified that during the summer of 1952 the one well, upon which the Independence Square system depended entirely for its source of water supply, had proved inadequate as to the quantity of water which could be pumped from it. Also, sand had started to appear during pumping operations. A new well was drilled, and a new pumping plant and pressure tank were installed late in the summer. Completion of the installation was effected in November, 1952. He testified that the new pumping plant installation has a production capacity of 1,000 gallons per minute which, together with the new pressure tank, should assure this sytem of ample water supplies at operating pressures of between 30 and 50 pounds per square inch. The cost of such installation was approximately \$5,000. He testified further that all service complaints in the future would be investigated immediately and that the improvements to the water system should eliminate all causes of past service complaints.

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The above-entitled application having been filed, a public hearing having been held, the matter having been submitted, and the Commission being full advised in the premises,

IT IS HEREBY FOUND AS A FACT that the increases in rates and charges authorized herein are justified and that present rates in so far as they differ from those herein prescribed are unjust and unreasonable; therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that applicant be, and it is, authorized to file in quadruplicate with this Commission after the effective date of this order, in conformity with the Commission's General Order No. 96, a schedule of rates shown in Exhibit A attached hereto, together with rules and regulations and four copies of a tariff service area map, and on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and the public, to make such rates effective for services rendered on and after February 1, 1953.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days after the date hereof.
