FOURTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds city and highway contract carrier permits. It transports syrup and empty syrup containers for The Coca-Cola Company between specified points in southern California. Prior orders in this proceeding have authorized it to deviate from the established minimum rates in connection with this transportation. The present authority is scheduled to expire February 7, 1953. Permission is now sought to continue to deviate from the minimum rates for a further one-year period. Applicant proposes that the authority previously granted be modified by increasing rates for the transportation of syrup from Los Angeles by 9 percent and that it be broadened to include operations from Los Angeles to Colton and Oxnard at rates comparable to those charged at other points.

The verified supplemental application shows that, except for increased operating costs, the conditions surrounding the transportation in question which justified deviation from the minimum rates generally still obtain; that the increased rates have been charged since May 1, 1952; that this increase, greater volume of traffic and improved operating efficiency have offset the higher costs; that Colton and Oxnard are intermediate to points now regularly served; and that operations under the sought rates may reasonably be expected to be profitable during the ensuing year.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the sought authority is justified and should be granted.

To prevent a lapse of applicant's authority the order herein will be made effective February 7, 1953.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the authority granted Export Forwarders, Inc., by Decision No. 42423 of January 18, 1949, as amended, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby amended by substituting for Appendix "A-l" thereof Appendix "A-2" attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof; and that the expiration date of the authority granted by said Decision No. 42423, as so amended, be and it is hereby extended to February 7, 1954, unless sooner changed or further extended by the Commission.
