O P I N I O N

Applicant Stockton City Lines, Inc., presently rendering a passenger stage service in the City of Stockton and immediate vicinity, requests authority to reroute a portion of its Edison Villa Route No. 5.

The route as presently operated crosses a bridge over the Mormon Channel, which is located on Lincoln Street between Lafayette and Church Streets. The proposed rerouting would be along Center Street between Washington and Worth Streets and along Worth Street between Center and Lincoln Streets.

As justification for the authority sought it is alleged that the city engineer of the City of Stockton has recently placed a weight limit of six tons on the bridge that crosses Mormon Channel and applicant's coach exceeds this weight. It is further alleged that applicant has made a careful survey of the area, and it is believed that no one will be seriously affected by the proposed change, but on the contrary the route as proposed will pass through a more densely populated area than does the present route. After full consideration the Commission is of the opinion and so finds that the proposed rerouting should be authorized.

ORDER

Application having been filed and the Commission being fully informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That Edison Villa Route No. 5, as described in Decision No. 45344 dated February 6, 1951, in Application No. 31894, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Route No. 5 - Edison Villa

Commencing at the intersection of Market and San Joaquin Streets, thence along Market Street, El Dorado Street, Washington Street, Center Street, Worth Street, Lincoln Street, and Charter Way to Fresno Street.

(2) That in all other respects Decision No. 45344 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
