### SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION

By separate petitions in this proceeding Dewey Reser, an individual, and Graham Bros., Incorporated, seek revision of certain minimum rates heretofore established for the transportation of decomposed granite and other materials in dump truck equipment between points within Los Angeles County.

Public hearings were held before Examiner Eryant on January 20 and 29, 1953. The matters are ready for decision.

The minimum rates governing the transportation of materials in dump trucks are set forth in City Carriers' Tariff No. 6, Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 7 (Appendix "A" of Decision No. 32566, as amended).

The Reser petition was filed on October 24, 1952. The Graham petition was filed on December 8, 1952 and amended on January 20, 1953.

For movements within Los Angeles County the tariff names rates in cents per ton from designated production areas to specified delivery zones. Shipments originating outside the specified production areas are subject to hourly rates or to tennage rates based upon the actual distances traversed. In general the distance rates are higher than the zone rates for comparable hauls. Both petitioners represented that there are continuing and substantial movements of materials from their respective shipping areas, that hourly rates are not suitable under such circumstances, and that the distance rates are too high to permit equal competition with other producers having the benefit of zone rates. For these reasons the petitioners seek the prescription of zone rates from their shipping points.

Dewey Reser is engaged in the business of excavating and marketing decomposed granite from an area in the westerly part of the city of Los Angeles known as the Hollywood Hills. His proposed production area would be bounded generally by Mulholland Drive on the north, Production Areas "Z" and "Q" on the east, Sunset boulevard on the south and Los Angeles City boundary on the west. Graham Bros., Incorporated is engaged in the production and sale of crusher base and other materials for use as a sub-base for roads and for revetments, breakwaters and for similar purposes. It operates a plant and facilities on Fier "C" in Long Beach harbor, and plans to establish facilities also on nearby Fier "A" in the near future. Its materials are brought principally from Santa Catalina Island by barge. The "production area" proposed by this petitioner would be bounded by the pier-lines and the Embarcadero.

A rate expert of the Commission's staff suggested a modification of Dewey Reser's zone proposal. Under the modification, two new areas would be defined instead of one. They would be within the area proposed as a single zone by Reser, but would not encompass all of such area. The Commission witness testified that the portion which he would omit from the suggested new zones is steep and not accessible to motor vehicles. The remainder he would divide into two parts because of differences in topography. He explained that the grades and curvatures of the streets and roads are more severe in the northerly part of the area. This witness stated that two zones are desirable in order that different rates may be established to reflect the different costs of truck operation under such conditions. He recommended a rate differential of approximately five cents a ton.

Neither petitioner offered a specific scale of proposed rates. Both urged that minimum zone rates be prescribed from their respective areas on bases generally comparable to those heretofore established from other areas similarly situated: Dewey Reser suggested that the rates from his proposed production area should be the same as those now applicable from an existing adjacent area (Production Area "Q"). The witness for Graham Bros., Incorporated asked that the Commission develop minimum rates in accordance with a study which he submitted showing the observed round-trip truck running times and one-way mileages from the proposed production area to various delivery zones.

The California Dump Truck Owners' Association, Inc., 2 indicated general concurrence in the smended Grahsm petition, but opposed both the Reser proposal and the suggested modification thereof.

Graham Bros., Incorporated originally petitioned for extension of an existing production area. The record shows that conferences between representatives of petitioner and of the California Dump Truck Owners' Association, Inc. produced agreement on the revised plan herein considered. The amended petition was filed at the initial hearing in accordance with the agreement.

within which Reser operates is a difficult one for truck movements, that points of origin within the area may vary from month to month as excavating sites are changed, that the different origins would in some cases produce substantially different truck operating costs, that the existing minimum rates from the adjacent Production Area "Q" are considered inadequate, that such rates would likewise be too low for application from the proposed new zone or zones, and that the suggested rate addition of five cents a ton for hauls from the upper zone would not be enough to bring the rates to a satisfactory level.

Zone rates have been established heretofore for transportation of various materials by dump truck equipment where regular and substantial movements are involved. It appears from the evidence of record that the transportation involved herein is such that the establishment of zone rates therefor is warranted. The following order provides minimum rates established in reasonable relationship to those existing from adjacent competitive production areas similarly situated, thereby removing discrimination against the shipments of the petitioners. The reasonableness of the rate level as a whole will be considered further in a separate phase of this proceeding.

The staff witness directed attention to a defect in the description of the present westerly boundary of Production Areas "Q" and "Z", wherein a street name is stated improperly. The defect will be corrected.

By petition filed on December 26, 1952, the California Dump Truck Owners' Association, Inc. seeks a 7-1/2 percent increase in the minimum zone rates for the transportation of rock, sand and decomposed granite in Los Angeles, Orange and Ventura counties and a change in the minimum weight from seven tons to eight tons.

## ORDER

Public hearings having been held on petitions filed in this proceeding by Dewey Reser and Graham Bros., Incorporated, as specified in the foregoing opinion, the evidence received therein having been considered carefully, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that City Carriers' Tariff No. 6, Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 7 (Appendix "A" to Decision No. 32566 as amended) be and it is hereby further amended by incorporating therein the pages attached hereto and by this reference made a parthereof, which pages are numbered as follows:
