The Western Pacific Railroad Company is authorized to construct eight additional spur tracks at grade across Army, Michigan and Twenty-Sixth Streets, all unimproved streets, in the City and County of San Francisco, at the locations described in the application. Applicant-shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

It is alleged that Army, Michigan and Twonty-Sixth Streets are not at present open to public use and travel, and this order is not to be deemed authority for such openings.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.
